This is the start of a new era for autism services in Northern Ireland! Our members and the wider autistic community welcomed this new legislation being passed.

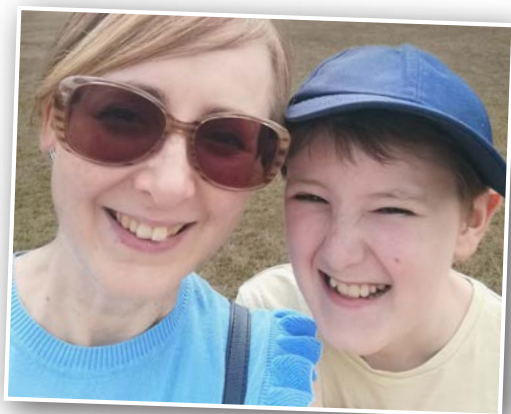
The legislation will introduce:

- ✓ Development of a regional early intervention service
- ✓ Development of regional adult support services
- ✓ Development of a regional information service
- ✓ Development of an autism training strategy
- ✓ Data collection to include prevalence of adults and children
- ✓ The introduction of an annual budget report on autism
- ✓ An independent scrutiny body to oversee implementation
- ✓ A NI Autism Strategy to include measurable targets and outcomes
- ✓ A NI Autism Strategy to be developed in consultation with the autism community.

My son was diagnosed with autism in 2016 and following diagnosis we were placed on a 6-month waiting list. During this time, we reached out to other support services that we could find ourselves, but success was limited, and we needed urgent expert advice on what to do. I saw an advert for a new evening Autism NI support group, I attended that night scared of what lay ahead but left with relief and the confidence to move forward, armed with experienced guidance and instructions on exactly what needed to be done.

I'm thankful to be part of a collaborative charity which works with the autism community to lobby government, drive research and provide lifeline support and services for individuals and families at every stage.

If you request Autism NI to collect a payment, confirmation of the amount and date will be given to you at the time of the request
- If an error is made in the payment of your Direct Debit, by Autism NI or your bank or building society you are entitled to a full and immediate refund of the amount paid from your bank or building society
 - If you receive a refund you are not entitled to, you must pay it back when Autism NI asks you to
- You can cancel a Direct Debit at any time by simply contacting your bank or building society. Written confirmation may be required. Please also notify us.
